Course content:

This course builds on the A2.1 course. The basic knowledge of German grammar and vocabulary acquired in basic course A1 and A2.1. will be further developed on the basis of everyday conversation topics and situations.

The language course "German Language Course B2.2" is suitable for students with advanced knowledge who have successfully completed the B 2.1. course with a certificate of achievement, or have approximately 420 classroom hours of German language instruction and achieved at least 145 points in the placement test.

Course content:

The course continues where the B2.1 course finished. The course consolidates knowledge of German at lower levels and expands to content that is more complex. The focus of this course is on the expansion of vocabulary, written expression, and talking about controversial topics. Students will expand their means of communication and deepen their understanding of grammar.

Students will give presentations on political and cultural topics from everyday life. Extemporaneous speaking and presentations will be given in front of an audience. Students will practice presentations in academic settings, as well as the creation of an accompanying handout. Other mediated strategies and work techniques include: understand reviews (book review), information from several texts, structured writing, use notes for summaries and text coherence.

Regular and active participation is required for successful completion of the course. This includes the completion of homework in order to continue practicing and consolidating what has been learned in the classroom.

The course consists of **90 hours of face-to-face training**. Attendance is compulsory. If you would like to receive a certificate of achievement, you may not miss more than 18 lessons (20%). The final grade consists of 10% homework, 30% oral participation and 60% final exam.

You have to expect at least an **additional 90 hours of work** for homework, own vocabulary work, preparation of presentations and preparation for the exam.

### „Ziel C2“ (Modul 1): Strategien zum Wortschatzaufbau

**Zielgruppe:** Der Sprachkurs „Ziel C2“ (Modul 1): Strategien zum Wortschatzaufbau ist für Studierende mit fortgeschrittenen Kenntnissen geeignet, die den C1.2-Kurs erfolgreich abgeschlossen oder im Einstufungstest mindestens 193 Punkte erreicht haben. **Kursinhalt:** Das Modul 1 „Strategien zum Wortschatzaufbau“ ist Teil des C2-Kurses, der aus insgesamt 6 Modulen besteht, die im Laufe der folgenden Semester sukzessive angeboten werden: Modul 2: Grammatiklücken schließen; Modul 3 „Fremdsprache Literatur“; Modul 4-6: Wissenschaftssprache Deutsch.

Haben Sie schon einmal **darüber** nachgedacht, warum die Deutschen ihre Zähne putzen, die Engländer ihre Zähne bürsten und die Japaner ihre Zähne waschen...? Und wie ist es in Ihrer Erstsprache?

In diesem Kurs widmen wir uns Fragen wie „Welche Wörter werden in welchem Zusammenhang verwendet (Kollokationen)?“ oder „Wie vermeide ich Stilbrüche?“ (Idiomatik). Der Kurs folgt der Methode „Wortschatz lernen mit Struktur“, d.h. Sie lernen, wie Sie Ihren Wortschatz durch verschiedene Strukturen und Struktureregeln erweitern können (Wortfamilien, Synonyme, Antonyme, Homonyme). Außerdem legen Sie im Kurs ein eigenes Vokabelheft nach Kopiervorlagen an und lernen, mit digitalen Korpora und Wörterbüchern zu arbeiten.

Eine regelmäßige und aktive Teilnahme sind Voraussetzung für **das** erfolgreiche Absolvieren des Kurses. **Dafür** ist ebenfalls **das** Erledigen von Hausaufgaben notwendig, um **das** Gelernte weiter zu üben und zu festigen.

Der Kurs umfasst 30 Präsenzstunden. Es besteht Anwesenheitspflicht. Wenn Sie einen Leistungsnachweis erhalten möchten, dürfen Sie nicht mehr als 6 Unterrichtsstunden (20%) fehlen. Sie müssen mit einem zusätzlichen Arbeitsaufwand von mindestens weiteren 30 Stunden für Hausaufgaben und eigene Wortschatzarbeit rechnen. Die Bewertung der Kursleistung erfolgt durch die Bewertung der Hausaufgaben. Es wird keine Klausur geschrieben.

Target group:

The language course "Grammar fit" is suitable for students who have completed a B1 course and would like to secure and deepen their grammar knowledge before or during a B2 course.

Course content and scope:

We repeat the A2 and B1 grammar. The grammar knowledge is to be consolidated on the basis of everyday topics and situations as well as many exercises. The exact content of the course is determined in consultation with the participants. The course accompanies the semester and covers 60 hours in total.

Regular and active participation is a prerequisite for completing the course. To do this, it is also necessary to complete homework in order to practice and consolidate what you have learned.

The course comprises 60 attendance hours. Attendance is compulsory. If you wish to have a certificate of achievement, you must not miss more than 6 hours (20%).
