Selected projects/initiatives may receive up to 1000€ financial support (for a total of €5,000 shared among winning projects), mentoring, and access to EMERGE resources.

Before submitting your proposal, please note:

- Collaboration is required: each proposal must include at least one university member and one external partner.
- Short instructions are provided in each section to guide your proposal.
- Members of the selection committee are not eligible to submit proposals.

If your initiative involves or is led by people with disabilities, minority communities, or marginalized groups, the EMERGE team will provide additional support to ensure equitable participation.
