<i>Course content:</i>	<p>The module provides a well-rounded overview of the relevant research literature on the social and cultural embedding of the economy.</p> <p>The starting point is survey-type overview literature, which is now also available in book form.</p> <p>Through this course, understanding is deepened through the reading and discussion of original texts.</p> <p>On the one hand, milestones of the discussion and, on the other hand, current contributions are used.</p> <p>Interdisciplinary references, especially to the sociological discussion, are a core component of the module.</p>
