<i>Course content:</i>	<p>Critical understanding of selected subject content; in-depth knowledge of French-language literatures in a historical and systematic perspective as well as selected methods of analysis and research.</p> <p>Contains in-depth knowledge of French-language literatures in a historical and systematic perspective as well as of selected academic methods of analysis and research; in-depth analytical skills with regard to questions in literary and cultural studies; ability to elaborate the essentials of academic texts and to present them in an appropriate manner, to extract the essentials from specialised texts and to present them in an appropriate manner.</p>

<i>Methodological competence:</i>	Ability to apply the acquired knowledge in guided academic work in a targeted manner; in-depth knowledge of academic work, with a focus on subject-specific research and analysis methods; knowledge of procedures for obtaining/evaluating information; mastery of presentation techniques (oral presentation, visualisation).
<i>Social and Self-competence:</i>	The students are able to acquire subject content both guided and independently; they are able to plan individual and group-based work processes sensibly and complete them in a timely manner; they deepen their ability to communicate subject content orally and in writing in a structured and methodically reflective manner and addressee-related manner; they deepen their ability to deal with conflict and criticism.
