About the University	Europa-Universität Flensburg is located in Flensburg, the northernmost city in Germany, near the Danish border. Founded in 1994, the university focuses primarily on education and social sciences. A distinctive feature of EUF is its German-Danish study programs, developed in cooperation with the University of Southern Denmark in Sønderborg. The modern campus is equipped with state-of-the-art technical and multimedia facilities and offers a wide range of leisure and sports opportunities, including a fully equipped fitness center.

Students do not need to show proof of funds for admission to the university. However, non-EU students must demonstrate financial resources to the German authorities when applying for a visa: • Required amount: €934/month × 6 months = €5,604 (for one semester) • Acceptable proof: 1. Blocked account in Germany 2. Scholarship confirmation 3. Notarized declaration of financial commitment (from a sponsor, legalized at a German consulate)

ACCOMMODATION

Is on-campus accommodation guaranteed for exchange students? Meal plan Options for oncampus accommodation?

The accommodations on campus are administered by a non-profit organization called Studentenwerk. The students must apply directly with them. The earlier the better the chance to obtain a room on Campus. The link is:

	The student fee of 233,60€/semester ensures that student prices are provided in the cafeteria, activities and public transportation ticket for Flensburg, the whole state of Schleswig-Holstein and Hamburg for the whole semester. There are no meal plans, since normally the students have only lunch at the cafeteria. They usually live in share apartments with a common kitchen thus they will have breakfast and dinner at home.
Does the university assist students to find off-campus accommodation?	If the student was not able to get a room on Campus we will assist to find an alternative place off-campus.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa? Please provide what you will issue, letter, forms etc., for students to apply for a visa

Foreign students wishing to enter the Federal Republic of Germany require an entry visa for educational purposes (or student entry visa) issued by a diplomatic representation of the Federal Republic of Germany (embassy or consulate) in the student's country of origin and entered into the passport. **This regulation does not apply to applicants from EU countries.** Prospective students should inquire in detail at an early stage about the visa requirements. They are warned against entering Germany with a tourist visa. A tourist visa cannot be retrospectively converted into a student entry visa or residence permit for educational purposes.

The **entry visa** is issued for three months only and must be converted into an **electronic residence permit (eAT)** at the Immigration Office (Ausländerbehörde). A minimum of 8 weeks before the visa expires you should request the eAT. The fee for the eAT is 105 €, and the extensions costs 90€

EU students do not need an entry visa and an electronic residence permit (eAT).

Are exchange students allowed to work and how many hours are they permitted to work? Is a special visa required for work?

WORKING IN GERMANY

Work Permission

- Non-EU students: allowed up to 120 full days or 240 half days per year
- EU students: no work permit needed

Note: Students may begin working **after** receiving the residence permit.

MEDICAL INSURANCE and others

Are exchange students able to apply for an insurance waiver if they have their own insurance coverage or are they required to purchase a compulsory plan? If yes please provide details and approximate cost?

HEALTH INSURANCE

Students under 30 must have **German public health insurance** unless exempt:

- Cost: approx. €120/month
- EU students may use their EHIC
- Non-EU students may apply for a waiver if covered by equivalent insurance
- Documents must be in English or German
