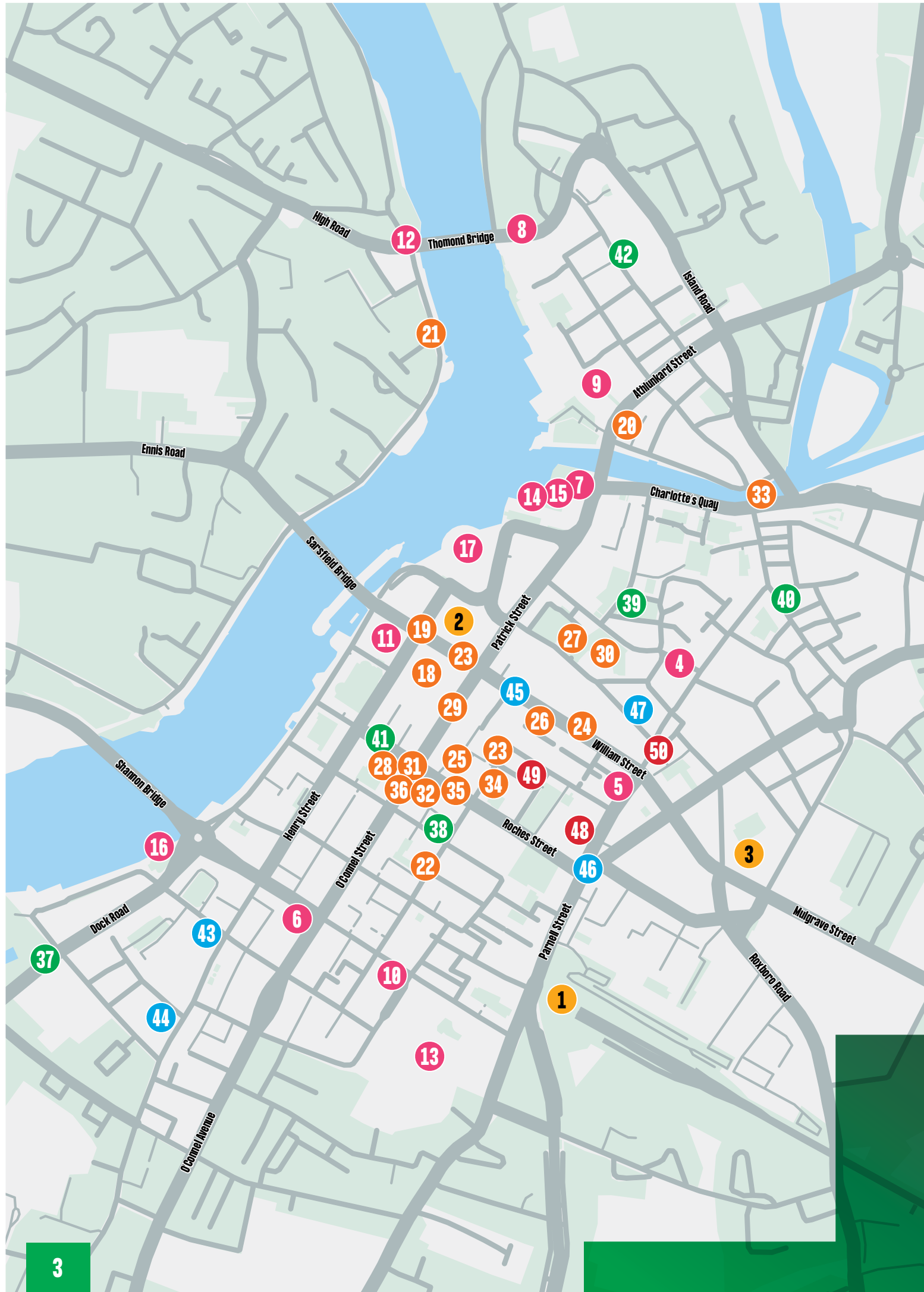

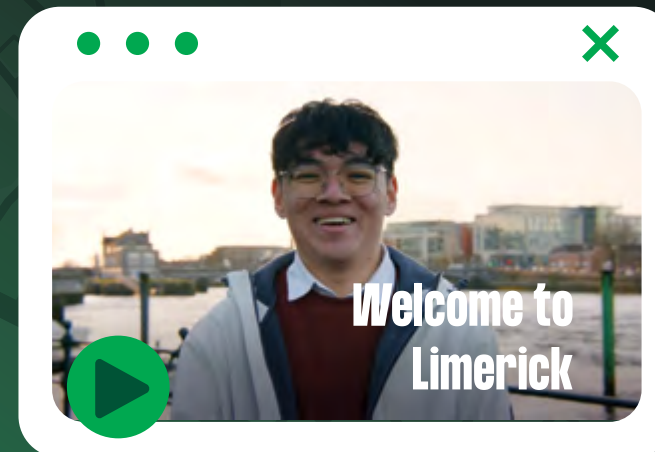

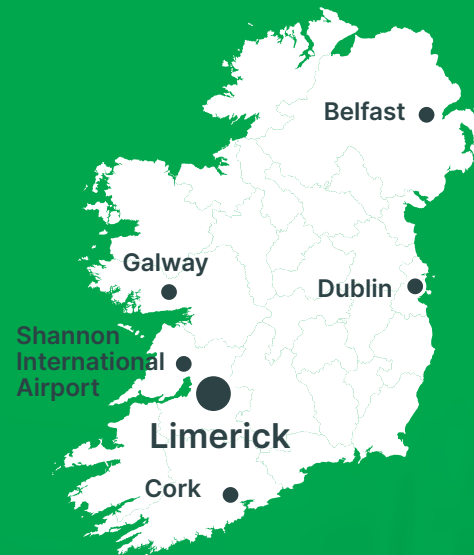
LOCATION

Limerick is in the Southwest of Ireland, boasting some of the best connections across Ireland, and is the gateway to the **Wild Atlantic Way**.

Limerick has great connections to Europe, the USA and the rest of the world through Shannon airport.

Limerick is served with excellent rail links, with frequent services between Limerick and Dublin and other key urban centres. There are also extensive bus services to Limerick from all parts of Ireland.

From the University of Limerick, the bus will bring you into the city centre within 15 minutes, students can also rent bikes from student villages or walk to the city centre by the riverside pathway which takes 50 minutes.

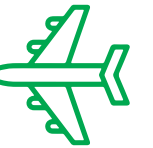


DID YOU KNOW?
Limerick City is located 30 kilometres from Shannon International Airport, which has full US customs pre-clearance. Shannon International Airport offers daily services to the US, UK and mainland Europe.

GETTING HERE

By Air

Limerick is just 30 minutes from **Shannon International Airport**, with direct daily flights to the US, UK and EU. Dublin Airport is just a two-hour drive away.



By Rail & Bus

Bus Eireann public buses 304 and 304A and the **Dublin Coach 310** service the University of Limerick. There are two bus stops in the University, one inside the Main Entrance and the second outside the **Student Life Courtyard**. You can pay using cash or use a Leap Card for a discounted fare. Please note that the 310 only accepts the Leap Card!



Colbert Station in the heart of the city connects Limerick to the rest of the country, with regular scheduled services to get you where you need to be. You can get here by taking the 304/304A bus from UL to Sexton Street. There are regular connections to Dublin, Tralee, Cork, Galway, Killarney, Rosslare, Donegal, Sligo, Shannon, Derry and many other locations.

There are frequent train services to Limerick Colbert Station from all over Ireland, more information can be found on the **IrishRail website**.

GETTING AROUND

By Bike & Foot

Limerick's Active Travel Scheme makes it easier to use more sustainable transport modes around the city, as part of a purposeful journey. Programmes linking key attractors (including our educational institutions) to the city centre to improve cycling and pedestrian infrastructure, continue to be rolled out across Limerick.

Access to and around the University is easy on a bicycle. Cycling facilities outside and inside the campus have been constructed as a response to the recent increase in the numbers of cyclists travelling to the campus. The University of Limerick is a smarter travel campus with the support of Limerick Smarter Travel, the University is committed to the promotion of sustainable modes of travel.

To promote cycling, the UL Bike Doctor operates each Tuesday during term from 10:00 to 15:00 offering free bike mechanic services as part of the Farmer's Market in the UL Student Courtyard. The service is paid for by the University.

Sign up for the **TFI Bikes** service to get access to a self-service bike rental. Stations are conveniently located throughout the city. At just €10 for an annual subscription it's super affordable!

A scenic **walk and cycleway** weaves its way along the River Shannon from UL into the city.



LIVING IN LIMERICK

THINGS TO DO

There are some great **sights, exhibitions and activities** to keep you busy in Limerick, here is just a sample of some of the things to do:

With arts and exhibits dating back to the Neolithic Period, **The Hunt Museum** is a must-see for visitors to Limerick.

Step inside the walls of Limerick's most iconic landmark! Discover the stories of ruthless King John, the noble knights, and rebellious natives. Located at the heart of Limerick's medieval quarter, **King John's Castle** brings to life over 800 years of dramatic local history.

St. Mary's Cathedral, built c.1172. Originally the palace site of Donal Mór O'Brien, King of Munster, who donated the site to the church. It is open daily from 09h00 to 17h00.

There are various **cinemas** dotted across Limerick that offer special student rates!

For activities to get the heart pumping check out **RollerJam, Bowling, Arena 5 UV Bowling** and **Jurassic Par Mini Golf**.

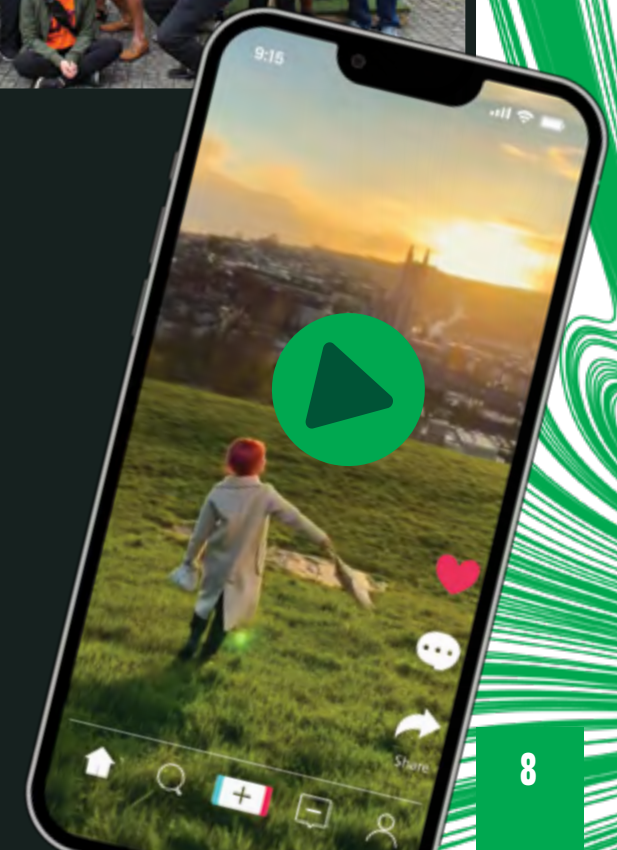

Arts and Culture are at the heart of Limerick City, with **museums, galleries, theatres and live music venues** all attracting thousands of people every week.

No matter what time of the year there are always cultural events happening across the city. Every September the cultural spaces across Limerick open their doors to Limerick City, creating a night of celebration of the arts here in Limerick. Each March the streets of Limerick come alive to celebrate our national holiday, St. Patrick's Day. Another one of the many fantastic weekends of culture in Limerick is **Riverfest**, with the annual festival held every May Bank Holiday weekend in Limerick. There are many amazing things that happen each year throughout the festival, but some of the highlights include Riverfest on the Shannon, the Riverfest BBQ Competition, Riverfest Village in Arthur's Quay Park, Great Limerick Run and a fireworks display.

Limerick is the host city to a wide variety of internationally acclaimed groups and organisations, including the **Irish World Academy of Music and Dance**, the Irish Concert Orchestra, Daghdha Dance Company, and the Island Theatre Group. The **Lime Tree Theatre**, **Belltable Arts Centre**, **University Concert Hall** and Millennium Theatre all host regular events.

Limerick has an incredible and continuously expanding **Street Art Trail**. Renowned street artists from all over the world come to Limerick to make their mark, and what they leave behind are vibrant, evocative, uniting murals and messages.

The Gaelic Grounds or Páirc na nGael is the principal Gaelic Athletic Association stadium in Limerick City and is home to the Limerick hurling and football teams.

- **Lough Gur** has a captivating heritage centre looking back at 6,000 years of life and Ireland's largest stone circle.



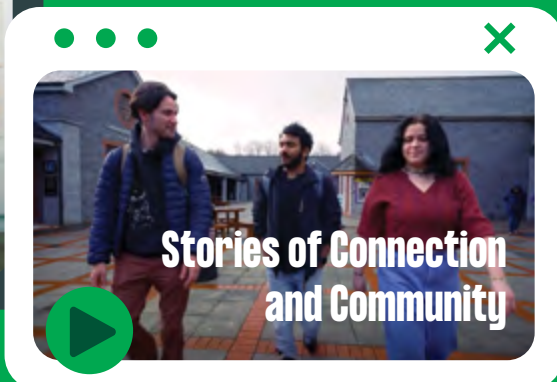
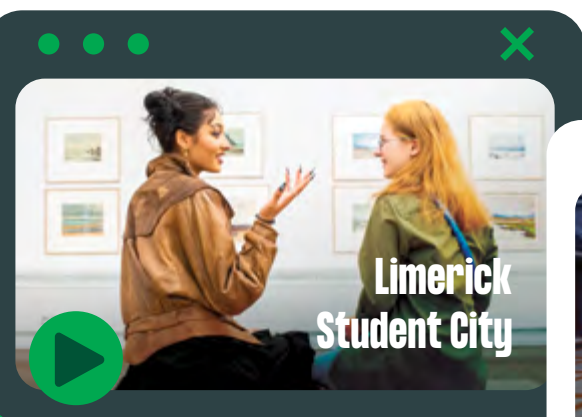
ADRENALIN RUSH

WHERE TO LIVE

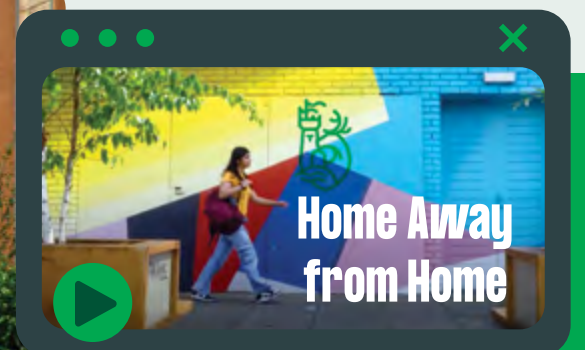
ON CAMPUS

OFF CAMPUS

Finding long-term accommodation in Limerick requires some planning, especially as demand can be high. WORKING IN LIMERICK

If you are interested in working while studying, we have **plenty of opportunities for you!**

International students that hold an immigration stamp 2 are permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during the university term. During the holiday period students can work on a full-time basis – up to 40 hours per week.
