How did you prepare for the semester abroad? What should be organized in advance?

Completing the steps required by the university (such as ordering the student card, logging into the student services, etc.) Applying for the accommodation, then accepting the offer for the accommodation, signing the contract, paying the rent and deposit and getting the key Booking an appointment with national authorities to register your address and order the yellow card (everything is explained by the international centre of the host university)

I am not sure if my perspective changed but it was great to experience everyday life in Denmark. I would say it was pretty similar to my expectations.

Even if it was a new country for me, Denmark has a very clear and understandable system (transportation, public institutions, etc.) so the whole process was relatively easy to navigate

Do you have any recommendations for a sustainable stay abroad (projects, initiatives, everyday life)?

Denmark is a country which focuses very much on sustainability so I would say just follow the instructions.

How did you manage financially? How much did you spend on visa (if applicable), travel, accommodation (per month), living expenses, leisure activities, other expenses (books etc.)? At first, I supported myself from the Erasmus finances and then my parents helped me financially. I travelled by tram which is around 1.30 Euro per travel, rent was 650 Euro per month and I did not have to buy any books because they were either provided by the lecturers or I found the material in the library. However, I know that this is not the case for all the courses.

What was your best/worst experience? Is there anything else you would like to share?

I cannot say that I had a best or a worst experience there, the whole process was relatively neutral in terms of experiences.

Would you recommend a semester abroad at your host university? For what reasons?

I would recommend a semester abroad at the University of Southern Denmark because it has a very good study environment, with multiple facilities for students. The university is very welcoming of international students, providing accommodation and support where needed.
