Studies at the partner university (e.g. period of lectures, language of instruction, courses offered, type of examination)

Studying at Jagiellonian University Kraków is not so complicated. The university has many departments, for instance, the Institute of Political Science and International Relations, the Institute of European studies, and many more. I was assigned to the Institut of European studies and took some courses from the Institute of Political Science and International Relations. The registration for some courses for the autumn semester usually starts in the middle of September till the first week of October. Students can register for the courses on the USOS website (an online platform for courses registeration, uploading the assignments, information about the registered courses, and finally their grades at the end of the semester). The lectures begin from the first of October and continue until the end of January. The evaluations for different classes and different institutions might be different. For instance, in the Institute of European studies, students have assignments and presentations during the lectures and for the final grading, some courses have written exams, presentations, as well as term papers. Nonetheless, Erasmus students can find a long list of courses which are taught in English as well as other language courses, for instance, learning the local language and other international languages.

Life in the host country (e.g. living, shopping, leisure, costs)

Life in Krakow is amazing, the city is very internationalized and hosts tourists almost from all over the world. I can call it an academic city too because the city welcomes many international and Erasmus students every semester. Several departments and Institutes are located close or even in the city center. There are countless restaurants, bars, clubs, and other social places around Main Square where is in the city center as well as numerous historical and ancient places to visit. For instance, Salt Mine is one of the famous places in Krakow that attracts millions of tourists and students from many parts of the world each year. Generally, the cost of living is not very high in Krakow. However, it depends on the places and individual way of life. In the city center, students can find delicious food at reasonable prices, accommodations in dormitories are not so expensive, and the same for public transportation.

Overall, as an Erasmus student, I have experienced an exciting Erasmus semester out there and figured out that life and study in Krakow are very comfortable and interesting.
