The study program at the host university was held in English and structured in lectures and seminars, depending on the subjects and chosen faculties. Regarding the examination, this would vary depending on the choice of either the area of studies or preferences of the professors (written exams, presentation, group projects...); therefore, there was nonunique examination form.

Furthermore, depending on the choices, students could have courses exclusively with other exchange students or be mixed with full-time student from the host university.

What intercultural encounters/competencies shaped your stay?

The variety of nationalities and different perspectives of seeing in every course made this experienced very rewarding and opened mindind

Which perspectives on the host country/country of origin have changed and why?

Before moving to Hungary, I had a missconmception of Hungary or especially Budapest, being a close dark and not developed area; however when arriving to Budapest, all my thoughts shattered. Budapest is a cosmopolitan and vibrant city that has a lot to offer, particularly for international students

What was your daily life like where you were? (e.g. living, shopping, leisure, inclusion)
My daily life consisted of a balance of an academic routine
and a diverse option of leisure activities even at the

In addition, when arriving, the international office gives the opportunity to the incoming students to have a local student buddy, so when struggling with the language or paperwork, these can help.
