

FAQ – Classroom Teaching in HeSe 2021/22 and Hygiene Concept

Face-to-face, hybrid or online teaching?

A large part of the events will take place in **presence**. Exceptions are various events in the international degree programs, which international students (who cannot enter the country) can continue to follow online.

If courses contain elements of blended learning (or comparable), these can of course be integrated into the courses in the usual mode before Covid.

What if I cannot be vaccinated and/or belong to a risk group?

People who cannot get vaccinated do not have to pay for the costs of Covid tests themselves even after 11.10.21. This is known at the test station, where the relevant proof must be submitted.

Teachers who are particularly at risk of their health can continue to offer their courses digitally; the teachers were informed about the procedure.

Students who are particularly at risk to their health (or could endanger household members) and therefore cannot participate in face-to-face events: please contact the Equal Opportunities Office (Arbeitsbereich für Chancengleichheit). There, in cooperation with the Audit Committee, a procedure for post-partial compensation is initiated.

These students should be provided with event documents via Moodle, as they can still continue their studies. For this purpose, the lecturers of the relevant events can receive support via FabricaDigitalis, including e.B. (coordinated by the Equal Opportunities Working Area) additional student/scientific assistants.

How is it ensured that the physical integrity and well-being of students, teachers and staff is preserved?

The **currently** valid hygiene concept of the EUF, which reflects the contents of the Higher Education Covid Ordinance of the Federal State of Schleswig-Holstein, is decisive for the implementation of the attendance semester. In order to ensure greater protection than the country stipulates, the EUF has decided to implement certain measures more strictly, such as a comprehensive mask requirement.

Under what conditions can I enter the university and participate in lectures/ seminars?

Entering the university buildings and participating in the face-to-face courses is subject to the "**3G regulation**" (tested, vaccinated or recovered). A corresponding, valid proof must be provided at the entrances of the buildings. The entrance into the buildings and the control of the "**3G**" **proof** is carried out at the entrances by the personnel of a security **service**. The unchecked entrances are closed. Possibilities are also being considered to assign a distinguishing mark during a first check, which is valid for the whole day ("48-hour transfer pass" for a "fast lane"). On campus, the distance rule of 1.5 meters applies. Deviations are possible where this rule is not acceptable, for example in seminar rooms and lecture halls.

Is there an obligation to wear masks?

In the buildings, in lectures, in corridors, offices and secretariats with public traffic and in the seminar **rooms, a general obligation to wear masks applies**. Only lecturers (e.g. during a lecture) or students giving presentations have the opportunity to speak without a mask.

What hygiene measures are taken in the rooms?

In the classrooms, the respective **ventilation plan** must be adhered to, even if masks are mandatory in seminars. Tables and contact surfaces in the rooms are **professionally cleaned and disinfected** once a day.

How is contact tracing designed?

From the beginning of the event, a seat-related contact tracing will take place for students in rooms with fixed seating. In rooms with loose seating, spatial contact tracing is carried out, so tables and chairs can be moved.

In rooms with fixed seating arrangements, the tables are equipped with **QR codes** for registration with the **Luca app**, rooms with loose seating arrangements receive QR codes on the doors. Likewise, all other rooms with public traffic (offices, secretaries, the rooms of the service facilities) will be provided with QR codes. At the same time, lists in paper form for alternative registration will be available everywhere, which will be kept in compliance with data protection.
