The Institute of Special Education at Europa-Universität Flensburg seeks to fill the following position in the Department of Special Educational in the Field of Learning as soon as possible:

Professor (Bes. Gr. W2) of Special Education/Learning Difficulties

Both in teaching and research, this professorship covers the entire breadth of the special education in the field of learning difficulties. We are looking for a person who has a relevant background in this field and who is able to design, implement and further develop teaching programs for the university's dual Master of Education in Special Education, the Special Education degree component of the Bachelor of Education degree program, and the Master of Education in Special Education.

Initially, the main task will be to manage and establish the three-year dual degree program M.Ed. Special Education, which is limited to three cohorts and will start in fall 2021. Other responsibilities include interdisciplinary collaboration in research and teaching, participation in one of the university research centers (ZeBUSS or ICES), and support in raising the university's profile.

The department has an empirically oriented research profile and applies quantitative or qualitative research methods, depending on the research question. The applicant's research focus should fall within the fields of teaching, diagnostics, prevention or learning support. The professorship is expected to represent, in both teaching and research, the entire range of academic theories, concepts and methods of knowledge acquisition for the specialization area "learning." The selected candidate is expected to have practical professional experience in the fields covered by this professorship.

Prerequisites for this position are a relevant university degree (master's or comparable) in Special Education or a comparable subject, with a focus on learning; an outstanding (*qualifizierte*) relevant doctorate; and additional academic research achievements, as obtained through a positively evaluated junior professorship, a postdoctoral lecturing qualification (*Habilitation*), or equivalent academic achievements. In addition, university-level teaching skills, the willingness to teach courses given in English, and the willingness to participate in the university's self-governing bodies are also required. Articles 61-63 of the Higher Education Act of the German federal state of Schleswig-Holstein shall further apply.

Europa-Universität Flensburg has a balanced gender ratio (m/f) with respect to its employee status group for university lecturers, and would like to further promote employee diversity with respect to the trajectories and competencies of its staff. Applications from persons with a migration background are explicitly welcomed. Severely disabled applicants with adequate qualifications will be given preference.
