Learning objective		The module provides a consolidation of knowledge and skills with regard to European law, based on the introductory courses in the first semester and combined with an enhanced hands-on approach. Students will be able to deepen their knowledge in specific fields of European law that are rooted in primary law, but have been developed for decades of policy-making.								
Professional competence		The course refers to lecture and seminar of "European Law: An introduction" and combines different methods such as role-play and future workshop within a scientific framework: It presents different environments that could operate as fields of activities of future postgraduates, e.g. a manufacturer, a service provider, an NGO, an administrative authority, an embassy, a publishing house. A matrix of parameters will be discussed and defined, such as the branch, the country, and the subject. Based on research and consolidated knowledge as well as competencies and additional research students will be able to view European law in its entirety and to meet the challenges of multi-level governance by developing routines that will be helpful for different settings.								
Methodological competence		Students will be able to analyse and apply EU law to specific problem areas. They will not only recall the use of primary and secondary law, but will need to gather additional information on the topic. Therefore, quantitative and qualitative research will be required, including the evaluation of official documents such as reports (e.g. statistical yearbooks, statements of accounts) and press releases.								
Interpersonal competence		The different backgrounds of the students will support them in viewing their case-studies in their entirety. Cooperation and mutual recognition will be fostered within the lecture. In doing so, students will set the stage for future engagement and encounters with lawyers who focus on judgments and legal provision in a professional context.
