# Welcome to the **EMERGE** Living Library

The EMERGE Living Library is a space of mutual respect, safety, and open dialogue. It's about breaking down stereotypes and prejudice—one story at a time. There is no judging here. Stories share their personal, lived experiences, and unique perspectives. Your role as a reader is to listen with an open mind and engage in respectful conversation. Conversations are meant to be dialogues—not monologues.

## **How it works:**

This catalog lists all the Stories available for you to listen to. All Stories are available in parallel sessions, and you can register to listen to one Story per time slot.

## **Each session lasts 30 minutes:**

5–10 minutes for the story  
10 minutes for conversation and questions  
10 minutes for a short break

- Slot #4: 13:00

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**“Expanding my Horizons and Not Looking Back”**

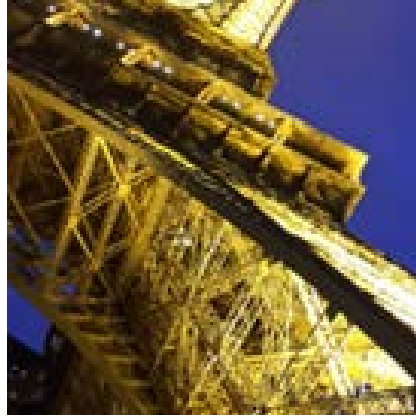
**Luca Heerey

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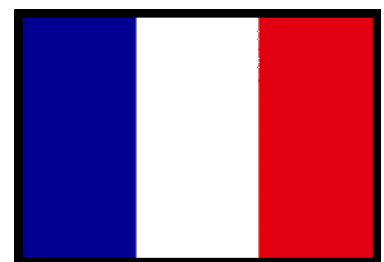

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## “Freedom of Curiosity”

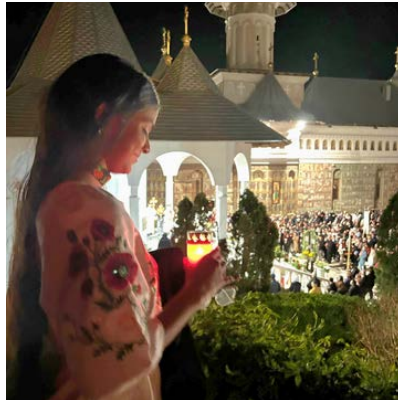
**Stephen Astante

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## “Between Pages and People: How My Education and the People Abroad Influenced Me”

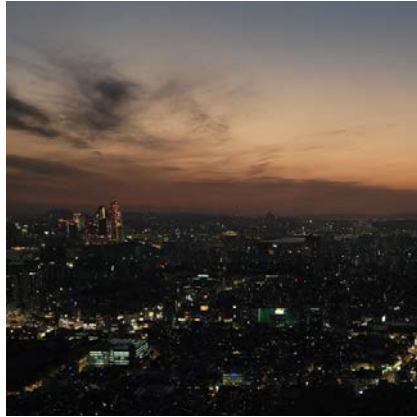
**Zoe Wiese**

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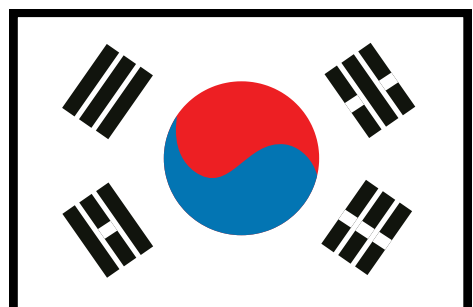

- If you are in Norway, take the tram to Lian / all events at Samfundet / Trip to Ålesund and Sunnmøre / Gunnerusbibliothek / Våttakammen in Bymarka / sauna at havet / mushroom picking.
- If you are in Limerick, try the Milkmarket, Belltable Theatre, and the Limetree Theatre.
- Stores are open on Sundays in Ireland!
- Always have a spare copy of your passport.
- Purchase a travel charging port.
- Always plan your trip beforehand and write down all transport information about the trip.
- Be open to and try new experiences.
- Look at the street art tour in Monmartre.
