# Teacher's material Plan for the lesson about beech forests

Title: Beech Forests and UNESCO World Natural Heritage

**Author:** Andrea Kuiper

**Quality Assessment:** Lea Stanke (EUF) **Level:** Secondary level I (Ages 10-12)

**Materials**: Video, sheet with additional information, worksheets, sheet with photos, rules. It would be best to go on a short excursion to a nearby forest. Otherwise the teacher could bring some leaves, beechnuts or rotten wood to show the students.

**Aims:** The students develop a better understanding of biocoenosis and habitats using the example of ancient beech forests and why they are protected by the UNESCO.

**Procedure:** for a lesson of about 45 min

1. Introduction: Video about "Sassnitz und sein UNESCO-Welterbe -- Sassnitz and its UNESCO World Heritage, (3.11 min – short information about the protected beech forest at the Baltic seaside)

## 2. Questions about the movie:

- Where is Sassnitz?
- What is the UNESCO?

#### 3. Hand out the text for the students about beech forests:

• Let them read it

### 4. Hand out the worksheets:

- Let them work with partners
- Compare the results in class
- 5. Put laminated sheet with photos on the desk for students to look at
- 6. Hand out and read the rules "How to behave in the forest"
