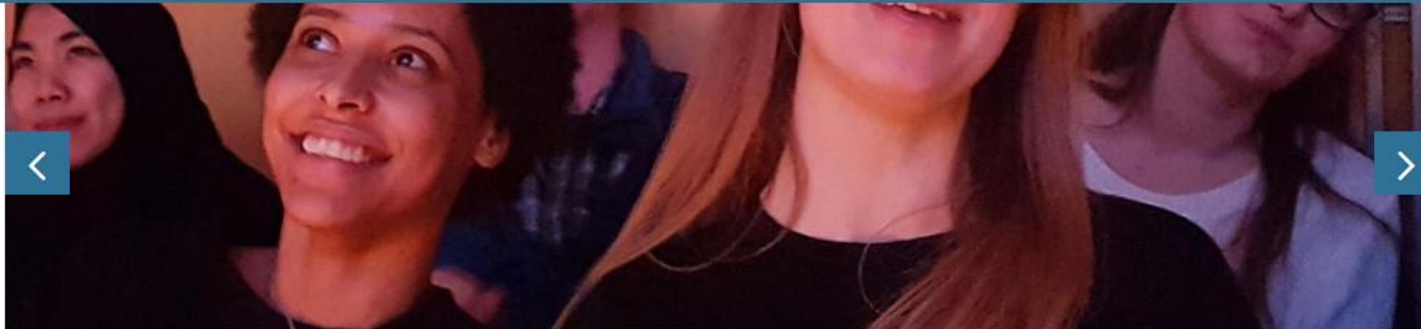

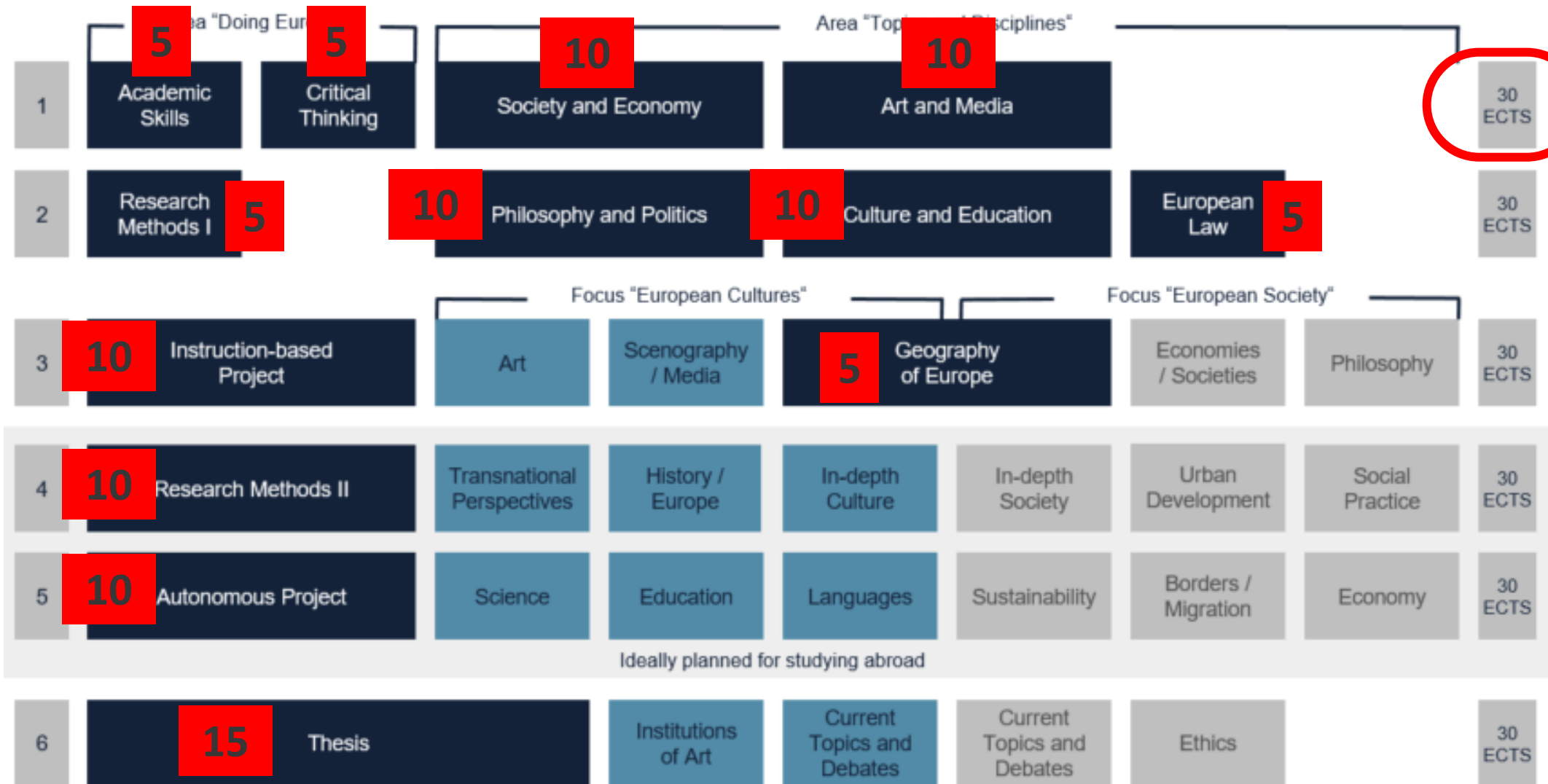

02 | EUCS – Study Rules

- Study and Exam Regulations:
 - **General Study Rules = *Rahmenprüfungsordnung (RaPO)***
 - Generic rules about courses and exams that apply to almost the entire university
 - Ex. Recognition of courses, examination board, recognition of special needs, plagiarism and cheating and all other examination rules...
 - **Specific Study Rules = *Prüfungs- und Studienordnung (PStO)***
 - These rules apply to EUCS only – Specific requirements to complete EUCS
 - Ex. All the courses offered, the examination type and all the specific requirements that differ from the RaPO

04| EUCS – Credit Points



All the other modules are worth 5 ECTS each

04| EUCS – Credit Points

- **Module = content of each unit of study**
 - 5 or 10 Credit Points = ECTS
 - ECTS = European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System
 - Gets completed with a module examination

- **ECTS**
 - 1 ECTS = 30 hours of work
 - 1 semester = 30 ECTS = 900 hours of work in 6 months
 - +/- 37,5 hours of work per week

- **Semester = 30 ECTS**

- **Study program = 180 ECTS**
 - All mandatory Modules = 95 ECTS
 - All 10 Modules of the specialization that you choose = 50 ECTS
 - Total of 4 modules of the other specialization = 20 ECTS
 - Bachelor's thesis = 15 ECTS
 - Mandatory semester abroad

Qualification objective		Students know basic categories and criteria of scholarly inquiry and are able to understand that the complexity of European Cultures and Society involves divergent conceptions and various methods of analysis developed in different disciplines. Interdisciplinary scientific and project approaches to the study of Europe are introduced in an interdisciplinary lecture-series. The four branches of projects: Research, Art and Scenography, Journalism, (Social) Entrepreneurship are introduced.			
Expertise		Students know different disciplinary and interdisciplinary approaches to cultures and society. They are able to understand and discuss the necessity of interdisciplinary work and have realised the challenge of Doing Europe. They start to be sensitive to the potentials and restrictions of disciplinary approaches to European topics and improve their ability for interdisciplinary understanding.			
Methodological competence		Students can distinguish between different critical approaches on the basis of methodological considerations. They also know that knowledge production and distribution take on different forms in the four branches of Doing Europe. Consequently, they can decide in which branch they will undertake an instruction-based project in DE 4.			
Social and personal skills		Students are willing to accept and to handle different theoretical approaches of academic disciplines diverting in methodology and terminology. They take complexity as a challenge and reflect on their own interest in Doing Europe.

	Qualification objective	Social diversity is transforming and shaping the context in which today's European organisations and individuals operate. The objective of this Module is to enable students to analyse economic aspects and social phenomena in a European context. The Module introduces the students to basic, diverging perspectives on economic and social issues within research on European societies. Departing from the concept of (horizontal and vertical) Europeanisation in the single European market, this Module offers two separate lectures: one will illuminate the effects of Europeanisation on economic issues, the other will deal with the impact of an institutionalised Europeanisation on society. Thus, the two lectures will shed light on both the economic and the social project that is Europe. This knowledge on the economic and social project of Europe will be synthesised in a common tutorial. Here special light is shed on the linkages and interdependencies between society and economy in the context of Europeanisation.		
Expertise		Upon completion of this Module, the students will be able to show an innovative set of theoretical insights. Students must be able to demonstrate critical insights into society, organisations, and economics. Students are able to understand and explain causes for the importance of selected theoretical approaches to these topics, and demonstrate an ability to communicate such research-based knowledge using the principles of scholarly, academic work. They will recognise, label and correctly apply terminology and concepts. They will be able to conduct a first analysis of scenarios and/or data within the field of society and economy, and to relate such scenarios/data to selected appropriate theoretical and methodological approaches.		
Methodological competence		To meet the requirements of this Module students should be able to identify methods in the literature of this Module. They will be able to correctly identify, label, and define methods and instruments, and to use the appropriate terminology. They will learn to demonstrate a critical approach towards sources on the basis of the knowledge provided in class.		
Social and personal skills		Students will be able to learn to collaborate in different ways, to present and analyse problems in the above-mentioned fields in a partner or group situation in a manner appropriate to the addressees, and to competently articulate their thoughts in a culturally appropriate and gender-sensitive manner.		
Course and study formats		Methods of instruction include, and are not limited to, ex-cathedra teaching, classroom discussions, student presentations and different forms of student group work and self-study.

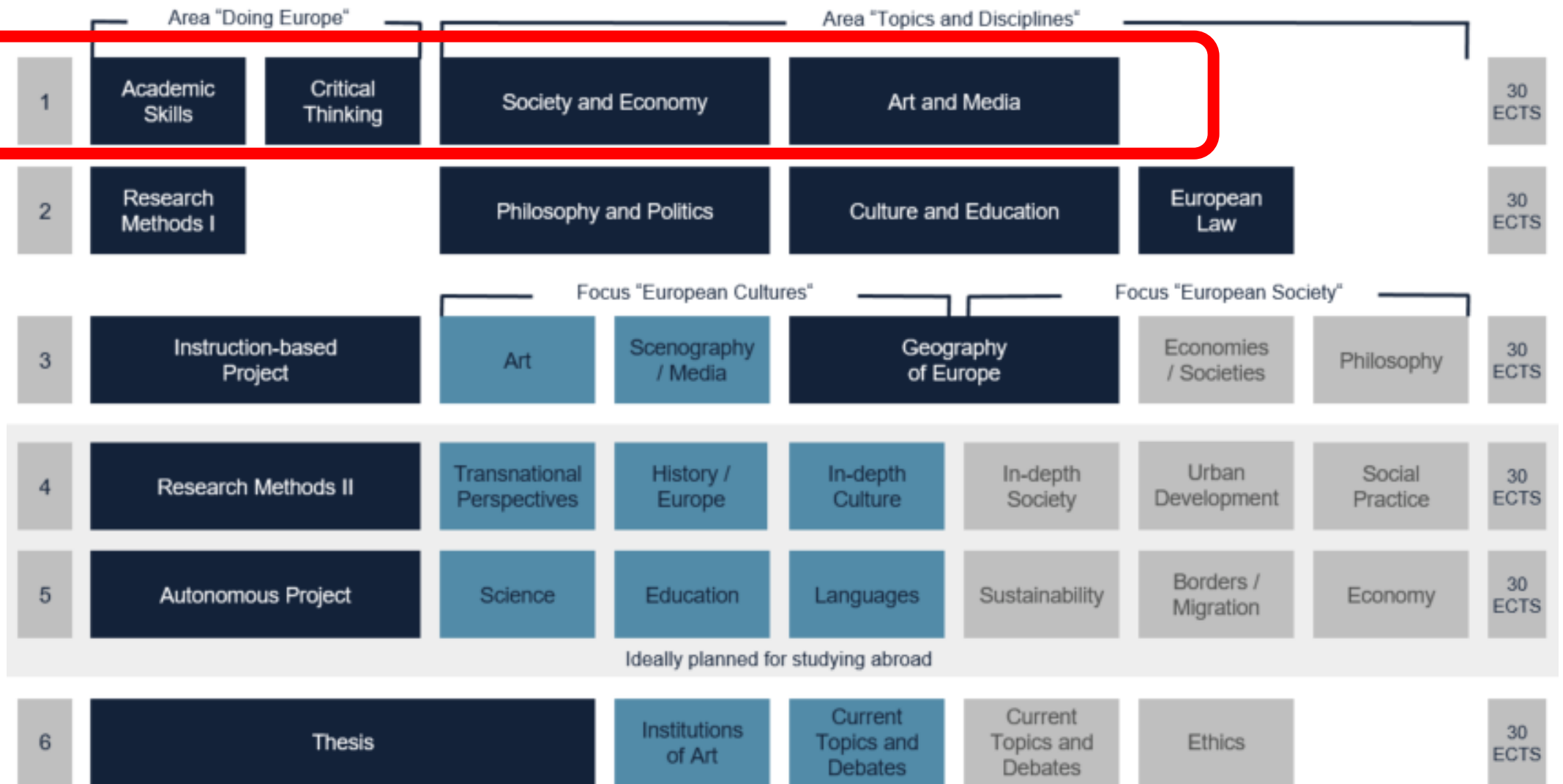

04| EUCS – Examinations

- You need to register for exams **yourself**
 - you have 3 attempts at doing each exam
 - if you fail an exam, you lose one of the attempts
 - if you don't attend an exam, you lose one of the attempts
 - if you fail a mandatory exam 3 times, you can no longer continue studying EUCS or another similar program in Germany
 - as a last resort, you can ask for a 4th attempt, but it is not automatic that you will receive it
 - copying in an exam or committing plagiarism means that you will fail the exam and get some other limitations (ex. Waiting period to repeat the exam again, registration in your transcript, up to exmatriculation)

05 | EUCS – Plan the semester

- There is an examination usually at the end of the semester (written or oral exam or written assignment)
- There is usually a re-take date at the end of the semester for exams (defined examinations week)
- There is usually a re-take date for written assignments in the next semester
- If you want to do an exam after these two defined times, it will be one year later and probably at the end of the semester when the course is offered again (ATTENTION: if the lecturer or the course changes, you need to re-take the course and do the exams using the new content)

E-Mails to lecturers and to the university administration are formal emails. Here are some points to consider:

1. This is a formal email, therefore greeting like the ones you use on social media are not to be used. So, please don't greet your lecturers with "hi", "Hello", "How are you doing", etc.
2. The correct way to address your lecturers in an email are:
 - Dear Mr. Smith (last name)
 - Dear Ms. Smith (last name)
 - Dear Catherine Smith (first and last name), if you want to write a gender-neutral email.
3. Please always be cordial. Don't demand answers. Be polite and use words like "please" and "thank you".
4. Don't just ask questions out of the blue without any context, as lecturers have many students, and they will not remember the conversation that you had with them without you reminding them about the content of the conversation. So, instead of something like "I would like to write my paper on the topic that we discussed (2 weeks ago)" try something like "I would like to write my paper on the topic X (describe the topic in detail)".
5. Don't just finish your email at the end of a random sentence. Always finish your email with something like "Best regards", "Kind regards", "Best wishes", or something similar, and please write your first and last name at the end of the email and your student number.
6. Please always contact your lecturers or the university administration using your student email, always sign the email with your name and write your student number.
