

Qualifikational	Social diversity is transforming and shaping the context in which today's European organisations and individuals operate. The objective of this module is to enable students to analyse economic aspects and social phenomena in a European context. The module introduces the students to basic, diverging perspectives on economic and social issues within research on European societies. Departing from the concept of (horizontal and vertical) Europeanisation on economic issues, this module offers two separate lectures: one will illustrate the effects of Europeanisation on society. Thus, the two lectures will shed light on both the economic and institutionalised Europeanisation in society. This knowledge on the economic and social project of Europe will be synthesised in a common tutorial. More special light is shed on the linkages and interdependencies between society and economy in the context of Europeanisation.									
Fachkompetenz	Upon completion of this module, the students will be able to show an innovative act of theoretical insights. Students must be able to demonstrate critical insights into society, organisations, and economics. Students are able to understand and explain causes for the importance of selected theoretical approaches to these topics, and demonstrate an ability to communicate such research-based knowledge using the principles of scholarly academic work. They will be able to conduct a first analysis of scenarios and/or data within the field of society and economy, and to relate such scenarios/data to selected appropriate theoretical and methodological approaches.

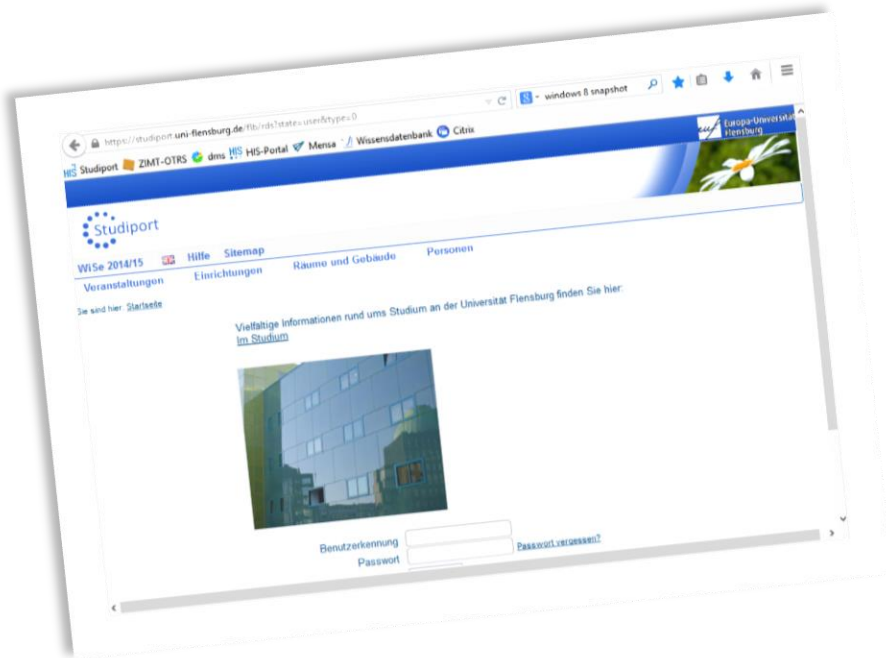
