

Getting to Campus

By train


Flensburg's central train station, which connects to Hamburg, Kiel, and Denmark, is within walking distance of the university (2 kilometers uphill). You can take a taxi from the queue in front of the station or catch a bus.

The campus is readily accessible by bus (Line 5A or 8A). There are several bus stops right on the campus. The closest to the conference venue is "Campus Uni".

By car

The **Bundesstraße B199 ("Osttangente") road** provides the easiest route to the university campus. The campus is just off this road. Simply follow the signs for "Campus Uni" or "Universität" or enter the address "Flensburg, Auf dem Campus 1" into your navigation device.
