1. Pathways to a permanent professorship







Becoming a professor in Germany

- To become a professor at a German university, you need:
 - To have completed your doctorate
 - "eligibility for professorship" (Berufungsfähigkeit)
 - → Requirements depend on your subject, research focus and academic interest





Becoming a professor in Germany

1. Habilitation

- Production of a habilitation treatise
- Includes an examination process that certifies the ability to teach in academic subject
- can also be achieved "cumulatively"

Habilitation at EUF:

Requirements:

- 1. a successful doctorate,
- several years of successful academic activity, and
- 3. academic affiliations with EUF documented by teaching or joint research projects.

Two habilitation achievements must be submitted:

- 1. a written habilitation thesis and
- an oral habilitation examination.

Becoming a professor in Germany

2. Junior professorship

- allows to supervise doctorates, have teaching obligations and role in academic administration
- Temporary position, some offer a tenure track option
- Evaluation (normally after 6 years the latest)

At EUF according to <u>"Satzung zur Zwischen- und Endevaluation der Leistung von Juniorprofessorinnen</u> und -professoren mit und ohne Tenure-Track (JunProfEvalS 2021)

3. Leadership of own junior research group

- International research experience is a helpful and occasionally even essential requirement
- Often financed by third party funding (e.g. DFG Emmy Noether, BMBF Nachwuchsgruppenleitung)

4. (Post-Doc position in industry)

2.1 Fellowships/ Stipends

- 1. DFG Walter-Benjamin Stipend and Position/ Deadline: anytime
- 2. Thyssen Post-Doc Stipend/ Deadline: No scholarships are currently being awarded
- 3. Maria Weber Grant (Teaching replacement for a research semester) / Deadline: 15. September each year
- 4. DAAD: PRIME (Postdoctoral Researchers International Mobility Experience)
- 5. Zeitverlag: Zia Visible Women in Science and Humanities/ Frist: 31.08.23
- 6. Akademie der Wissenschaften Hamburg: Young Academy Fellows/ Deadline: Spring 2024







2.1.1 DFG Walter-Benjamin Program

1. Purpose:

- starting independent research career and exercise autonomy
- fostering the mobility and thematic development

2. Eligibility Requirements:

- Researchers in the early post-doc training phase
- Change to research institution in Germany (position) or abroad (fellowship; if based in Germany before)
- Refugee researchers can apply for projects carried out in Germany (no restrictions with regard to the career phase)
- **3.** Funding Duration: up to 2 years

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2.1.2 Maria Weber Grant

- 1. Purpose: temporary partial replacement for up to 12 months to take over parts of the teaching duties to gain the freedom to carry out their research.
- 2. Eligibility Requirements:
 - early-stage researchers in the postdoc phase or junior professors
 - Working at a German research institution
 - from all disciplines; topics of interest to Hans Böckler Foundation prioritized
 - university is prepared to release the applicant from parts of the teaching
- **3.** Funding: up to 1 year with 20.000,- per semester
- 4. Deadline: 15 September each year

2.2 Project Grants with funding of own position

- 1. DFG Research Grants
- 2. DFG Heisenberg Program (for those meeting all requirements for a permanent professorship appointment)
- 3. Horizon Europe and other international funding lines:
 - MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships (next deadline: Sept. 2023)
 - Global Challenges: collaborative projects (call-specific topics)
 - NORFACE "Enhancing well-being for the future" / Frist: 21.09.2023
- 4. BMBF Project Grants (call-specific topics)
- 5. Foundations
 - Fritz Thyssen Stiftung: Project funding (deadline every year: 15.2. & 15.9.)
 - Volkswagen-Foundation: Open Up (Humanities & Cultural Studies; next deadline 2024) or <u>Pioneering Research</u> (High-risk, high-gain research)
 - Diligentia Stiftung: Project funding empirical research (deadline: early 2024)







2.1.1 DFG Individual Research Grants

1. Eligibility Requirements:

- Qualified researchers holding a doctorate from all disciplines and topic open
- working or planning to work at German research institutions
- Collaborative applications are possible

2. Various funding modules including

- Module Temporary position for PI (Eigene Stelle) for national and international scientists holding a PhD to focus exclusively on their projects
- Basic Module: direct project costs, <u>project-specific staff</u>, instrumentation, publications
- 3. Funding Duration: based on individual needs (normally 3 years)
- 4. Application process: no deadline, at least 6 months before intended start



2.1.2 MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships

1. Purpose: Acquisition of new skills through advanced training, international, interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral mobility.

2. Eligibility Requirements:

- Qualified researchers holding a doctorate
- from all disciplines and topic open
- European Fellowships: coming to Europe or moving within Europe
- Global Fellowships: Europeans or long-term residents moving to non-Horizon member state
- **3.** Funding Duration: 12-24 months (Global Fellowships plus 12 months return phase)
- 4. Application process: Annual calls, next deadline: Sept. 2023

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2.3 Researcher groups

- 1. DFG: Emmy Noether-Programm (junior research group leader)
- 2. BMBF Nachwuchsgruppenleitung (call-specific topics)
- 3. ERC Starting Grant (2 7 years after PhD, autumn 2023)







2.3.1 ERC Starting Grants

1. Purpose: basic and frontier research for individual researchers in Europe funded through the European Research Council (ERC)

2. Eligibility:

- For post-docs, junior professors & professors between 2 and 7 years after PhD
- undertaken in EU Member States or Horizon Europe Associated Countries
- Sole selection criterion: scientific quality of project proposals and applicants
- 3. Funding: up to 1.5 million euros for up to 5 years
- 4. Application process: yearly calls; next deadline autumn 2023

2.3.2 DFG: Emmy Noether-Programm

1. Purpose:

- qualify for appointment as a university professor (research, teaching, leading)
- attract outstanding early career researchers (back) to Germany from abroad

2. Eligibility Requirements:

- at least two years and normally max. of 4 years postdoctoral experience
- not open to those already qualified for a professorship
- substantial international research experience
- Applicants from abroad are expected to continue careers in Germany

3. Funding duration: 6 years
