DFG Funding for Leona Polyanskaya's work on the nexus between linguistic experiences, behavior and decision-making

Erste DFG-Heisenberg Förderung an der EUF zum Thema Sprache, Kognition und sozialer Toleranz

We are delighted to announce that Dr. Leona Polyanskaya has been awarded a DFG Heisenberg Funding (2025–2030) for her research on the impact of linguistic experience on metacognition, metalinguistic awareness, decision-making strategies and social tolerance. Based at ICES, Leona explores how linguistic experience shapes cognitive processing and influences social attitudes. She investigates the role of metacognition in mediating the link between language and behavior, examining how multilingualism affects metalinguistic awareness, decision-making, and tolerance towards linguistic diversity and works closely with Nils Langer (Institute for Frisian and Minority Research) and Mikhail Ordin (Universidade de Coimbra). DFG: International Cooperation – Standing Open Proposal Submission in Individual Grants Programme / No Deadline

DFG-Förderung für transnationale Forschungsprojekte mit europäischen und internationalen Partnern

The German Research Foundation (DFG) supports transnational research collaboration through agreements with multiple funding organizations in Europe and worldwide. In addition to fixed-deadline calls, some agreements allow for **Standing Open Procedures**, where proposals can be

submitted at any time. **European** partners include Austria (FWF), Belgium (FWO, F.R.S.-FNRS), Czech Republic (GACR), Luxembourg (FNR), Poland (NCN), and Switzerland (SNSF), with a bilateral Lead Agency agreement in South Tyrol (Italy). **Worldwide**, the DFG cooperates with Brazil (FAPESP), Colombia (UNIANDES, UdeA), India (ICSSR), Turkey (TÜBITAK), and the USA (NSF in selected fields). Applications follow parallel submission procedures, with evaluations conducted independently by both funding agencies. Funding is granted only to proposals positively reviewed by both sides. VolkswagenStiftung: Open Up – New Research Spaces for the Humanities and Cultural Studies / Deadline: 03.04.2025

Förderung für explorative Forschungsvorhaben

The VolkswagenStiftung invites research teams in the humanities, cultural studies, and theoretical social sciences to apply for funding under the Open Up initiative. The program supports projects that explore new and original research spaces, encouraging multi-perspective approaches to complex and underexplored topics. Teams of two or three researchers (with the main applicant affiliated with a German university or research

institution) can apply for up to €300,000 (two-person teams) or €400,000 (three-person teams) for a period of up to 1.5 years. The selection process includes an anonymized application procedure and Distributed Peer Review. TWAS-DFG Cooperation Visits Programme for early career researchers from the MENA region or Sub-Sahara Africa DFG Förderlinien für Forschungsaufenthalte in Deutschland / Deadline: 19.05.2025

The German Research Foundation (DFG), in collaboration with The World Academy of Sciences (TWAS), offers funding programs for three-month research and collaboration stays at German research institutions. One program line is open to early-career researchers from Egypt, Algeria, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Oman, Palestine (West Bank and Gaza Strip), Syria, Tunisia, and Yemen, while another program line is aimed at early-career researchers from Sub-Saharan Africa. Both programs support researchers from all disciplines who have been active in a scientific system in their home country for at least five years and have obtained their doctorate no earlier than 2020 (with possible extensions for researchers with children). The DFG provides a monthly stipend of €2,350 to cover living and visa expenses, up to €1,350 for travel costs, and up to €700 per month for project-related expenses. Applications must be submitted by the guest researchers to TWAS by May 19, 2025, and require an official invitation from the German host institution outlining the research topic and available infrastructure. The host institution is encouraged to assess the potential for long-term collaboration before extending an invitation. Further information. Funding for transdisciplinary research with societal impact

The Change Fellowships program by the Volkswagen Stiftung supports postdocs and junior professors from all disciplines who have completed their doctorate at least two years ago. The program enables researchers to conduct transdisciplinary research with a strong practical focus, addressing societal challenges and initiating transformation processes. Collaboration with non-academic partners (e.g., NGOs, associations,

DFG: Strategic Funding Initiative in Artificial Intelligence Continues /

Förderung für KI-Emmy Noether-Gruppen und Ideenwettbewerb

The German Research Foundation (DFG) has decided to continue its strategic funding initiative in artificial intelligence (AI). In two additional calls, up to 15 Emmy Noether Research Groups focusing on AI methods will be funded, with the first funding decisions expected in 2026. The initiative aims to provide outstanding early-career researchers with optimal conditions to advance AI research and establish the next generation of leading AI scientists in Germany. Additionally, in the second half of 2025, the DFG will launch a competition for ideas to identify specific funding needs for AI research. Based on submitted proposals, expert discussions will explore potential adaptations to the DFG's funding portfolio. DFG: Cost-saving measures implemented such as temporary Suspension of New Priority Programme Calls DFG ergreift Maßnahmen zur Ausgabenstabilisierung.

In response to inflation and rising costs, the German Research Foundation (DFG) is implementing measures to stabilize expenditures and maintain funding opportunities. Due to increased personnel costs and higher prices for scientific equipment and materials, the call for new Priority Programmes (SPP) has been suspended for one year. The next submission deadline for new SPPs, originally set for October 15, 2025, has been canceled, meaning new SPPs will not receive funding in 2027. The next opportunity to submit proposals will be on October 15, 2026, for funding starting in 2028. Applications submitted in 2024 for funding in 2026 remain unaffected. Additional cost-saving measures have been introduced across other funding programs, including reductions in individual grant approval rates, budget cuts for Collaborative Research

Centres, and temporary restrictions in Graduate Schools. The DFG aims to ensure long-term funding stability and fair competition across its grant programs. Source: DFG-Information für die Wissenschaft Nr. 12.

European Commission Adopts 2025 Work Programme and Launches Consultation on the Next MFF /

EU-Kommission startet Konsultation zur zukünftigen Finanzplanung

On February 12, the European Commission adopted its 2025 Work Programme, outlining key political and legislative initiatives for the coming year, including several relevant to research and innovation. Notable initiatives include the AI Continent Action Plan, the EU Start-up and Scale-up Strategy, and the Horizon Europe interim evaluation, with legislative revisions such as the REACH regulation update and the EU Space Act planned for later in the year. Additionally, in July 2025, the Commission will present its proposal for the next Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), covering EU spending beyond 2028. As part of this process, the Commission has launched a public consultation open until May 7, 2025, including a thematic consultation on funding for European competitiveness. This consultation is of particular interest to the research and innovation sector, as it addresses potential reforms and integration of EU funding programs. Further information.
