It's been two months since the EUF Centre for Irish Studies opened, so we thought a progress report — looking backwards at some highlights from 2023 and forwards at future delights in January, February and March — would be a nice way to start 2024!

#### ~ Milestones for 2023 ~

In the past year, there was plenty of activity leading up to the opening of the Centre, including the end of the co-hosted lecture series with CAU-Kiel, "21st-Century Joyce: *Ulysses* 100 Years On" (Jan-Feb 2023), Prof Hans Walter Gabler's "James Joyce Birthday Lecture" as the finale of lecture series (Feb 2023), the hosting of "Ireland and the Birth of Europe: An Exhibition" curated by the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs as part of the EUF's Europe Week (May 2023), the 2nd EUF Bloomsday (June 2023), the co-hosting of the Irish Studies and Cultural Theory Summer School in Vienna (July 2023), and the *Finnegans Wake* Reading Group (April-Dec 2023). Our members participated in and lectured at the James Joyce Summer School in Trieste, the Irish Studies and Cultural Theory Summer School in Vienna, the EFACIS International Conference, the Anglistentag, the Annual Conference of the Society for the Study of British Cultures (Britcult), the Akademie Sankelmarkt's "Die 'grüne Insel' nach dem Brexit," and the DACH Victorianists Workshop. They also organized author visits, such as Catherine Prasifka to CAU-Kiel, produced a number of publications, and offered courses at their respective universities touching on Irish literature, culture, and history. For us, one of the highlights of 2023 was our Inauguration Event: we were thrilled to welcome the Irish Ambassador to Germany, H. E. Dr. Nicholas O'Brien, whose eloquence was harmonized by wonderful speeches by Prof Dr Ulrich Glassmann (VP-International, EUF) and Prof Dr Monika Eigmüller (Interdisciplinary Centre for European Studies, EUF). We were enlightened about Irish language by Prof Dr Raymond Hickey (Essen) and the Irish Gothic by Prof Christina Morin (Limerick); and Prof Dr Katharina Rennhak, Prof Dr Dieter Fuchs, and Dr Anne-Claire Michoux dazzled us with a Round Table on Irish Studies in Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. The evening was capped off with Irish-inspired catering by "Anna und Meehr" and the rousing tunes of Drumchapel Mist. The ground floor of the Helsinki building was transformed into an evening of festive dancing, music, and feasting!!

Many of you might remember the James Joyce Birthday Lecture delivered by the brilliant Gabler on 2 Feb 2023. This year, on 2 Feb 2024 at 19:00 in the Carl-von-Ossietzky-Buchhandlung, (Große Straße 34, Flensburg) we will host our second (and therefore annual!) Joyce Birthday Lecture... but this time with a twist!

Combining St Brigid's Day\* with the Joyce Birthday Lecture, hence "Brigid meets Joyce," we are offering a special feminist twist on Joyce. **Jan Carson** — Northern Irish author of *The Firestarter* (2019), *The Last Resort* (2021), *The Raptures* (2023), and many more! — will be joining us for an evening of reading and discussion, using the focal points of legacy, place, and, most importantly, the role of women relative to her work and Joyce's.


The cost for the beer tasting is 35 euros per person (to be paid in cash at the door or via Paypal/bank details) and registration is a must!
